Sustainable Development & Event Sustainability Policy – ISO 20121:2024
Circuit Paul Ricard

Circuit Paul Ricard is a historic French racetrack located in Le Castellet, an environmentally sensitive area within the Sainte-Baume Regional Natural Park in the South of France. Inaugurated in 1970, the Circuit has been at the forefront of technological innovation driven by a commitment to pursuing excellence and delivering unique experiences to motorsport enthusiasts and visitors alike.

Recognising the environmental, social and economic responsibilities associated with its activities, Excelis SAS has been committed for more than a decade to an ambitious sustainable development programme aimed at creating positive and lasting impacts both within the Circuit and in the surrounding area, while contributing to local socio-economic development and enhancing its overall performance.

In line with the Circuit's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) commitments, this policy reflects the need to protect the natural environment and preserve the local and regional dynamics that support sustainable development, while placing people and stakeholder engagement at the heart of its strategy.

To achieve its short, medium and long-term objectives, contribute to climate change mitigation and strengthen the positive socio-economic impacts generated by its activities, Excelis SAS has decided to implement the internationally recognised **ISO 20121:2024 – Event Sustainability Management System** at Circuit Paul Ricard. This framework provides a structured approach to integrating sustainability into the Circuit's governance, operations and events, supporting continuous improvement and creating lasting value for the environment, society and the local community.

This decision reflects Excelis SAS's commitment to implementing the principles and values promoted by ISO 20121:2024 and set out in this Policy, as further detailed in the document "4.5 Mission Statement ISO 20121_Circuit Paul Ricard", namely:

In alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Excelis SAS has implemented an Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) strategy aimed at ensuring the continuous improvement of the Circuit Paul Ricard's activities and performance in terms of sustainability. - **Diversity & Inclusion**: Organizing activities in collaboration with local NGOs and associations to promote diversity, inclusion and equal opportunities.
